ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

Chaudhary Charan Singh University, Meerut, established in 1965, is one of the premier higher educational institutions in western Uttar Pradesh. It has a picturesque campus covering 222 acres of land. It also has the credit of being first university of the city to introduce M. Phil program in 1969. In 1973 Postgraduate level courses were also introduced. There are nine faculties namely, Agriculture. Arts, Education, Science, Commerce & Management, Ayurveda, Engineering, Law and Medicine with 22 UGC and 35 self-financed courses providing a job-oriented edge to the conventional education. Presently, 20 Government, 50 grant-in-aid, 2 medical and 909 self-financing professional colleges/ institutions and one constituent college is also affiliated to Chaudhary Charan Singh University.

ABOUT BHARATIYA BHASHA SAMITI

Bharatiya Bhasha Samiti: A High-Powered Committee for Promotion of Indian Languages has been constituted by the Ministry of Education, Government of India, vide letter no.8-46/2021/L-II, dated 15th November, 2021. The mandate of this committee is to explore and recommend pathways of the holistic and multi-disciplinary growth of Indian languages as envisaged in the National Education Policy-2020. The committee has been also entrusted to advise the Ministry on all matters pertaining to revitalization of existing language teaching and research and its extension in various institutions in the country.

ABOUT THE DEPARTMENT

The Department of Political Science was established in 1977. Post Graduate teaching commenced in July 1978. Research component followed soon with the registration of M.Phil and Ph.D candidates in 1980. Apart from hundreds of Masters and M.Phil. students, approx. 250 candidates have successfully completed their Ph.D research, around 57 candidates have done PDF from the Department till date. The Department also started Master of Public Administration (M.P.A) under self-financing scheme in 1994 and since then MPA program is catering to the needs of aspirants of Indian administration. Government of Uttar Pradesh has established Pandit Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Shodhpeeth (Research Chair) in the Department in January 2018, to initiate and strengthening the research on Pandit Deen Dayal Upadhyaya's philosophy. Further on 10 Feb 2019 Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India established Babu Jagjeevan Ram chair in the Department.

ABOUT IPSA

The Indian Political Science Association (IPSA) is the highest, the oldest and the largest academic and professional body of teachers and scholars of Political Science and Public Administration in India. The Indian Political Science Association was established in December 1938. The first conference was held on 22-24 December 1938. In September 1939, the IPSA started publication of a quarterly journal entitled "The Indian Journal of Political Science (IJPS)". In 2009, the IPSA started publication of a bi-annual journal in Hindi entitled "Bhartiya Rajniti Vijnan Shodh Patrika". Prof. Sanjeev Kumar Sharma became the first Editor of the Hindi journal. In its history of more than 86 years, IPSA has organized Annual Political Science Conferences regularly. The IPSA invites you to become a member of the association and actively participate in its activities.

ABOUT THE CONFERENCE

The underlying sentiment behind the organization of the national seminar on the theme “Indian Language Family: Unity and Integrity”, jointly organized by the Bhartiya Bhasha Samiti and the Department of Political Science, Chaudhary Charan Singh University, Meerut, is the idea that Indian languages are, in essence, branches of a single linguistic family. Just as different members of a family share common genes, values, and emotional bonds, Indian languages similarly exhibit deep unity in grammar, phonetics, word formation, and cultural expression.

The fundamental spirit of the Indian Constitution also upholds this balance and unity among diverse languages. Through Articles 343–351 and the Eighth Schedule, Hindi has been designated as the official language while state languages have been accorded equal respect. This constitutional arrangement symbolizes balanced integration within linguistic diversity. Rather than viewing linguistic diversity as divisive, this seminar seeks to highlight its intrinsic unity. The shared roots and sentence structures in Sanskrit-derived languages stand as evidence of this unity, while the Dravidian languages reflect a shared familial heritage through Sangam literature.

The seminar will bring together linguists, political scientists, and literary scholars to deliberate on the origin of language families, migration theories, integration in the digital age, and language preservation. By weaving linguistic diversity into a thread of unity, this academic gathering aims to strengthen the process of nation-building.
